Git

NCSA offers several options for Git repositories.

GitHub.com

git.ncsa.illinois.edu

- NCSA offers a self-service git server at <https://git.ncsa.illinois.edu/>. This is a [GitLab](#) setup, similar to GitHub, but hosted locally at NCSA. It *allows* either public or private repositories, projects, and groups. But public repositories are recommended to instead be hosted at GitHub, while NCSA's GitLab is intended more for private repositories.

Subversion (SVN)

Request a New Subversion Repository

 - Name you would like for your repository
 - Who will need access to the repository (Kerberos user name)
 - If you would like anonymous read access via viewvc or svnserve

Converting a CVS to Subversion Repository
